From April 1st to 3rd, partners gathered in Palermo for a vibrant and productive Coordination Meeting and Learning Activity. A special thanks to CESIE for the warm welcome and excellent hosting in Palermo! This three-day event provided a valuable opportunity for collaboration, reflection, and collective capacity building within the framework of our ongoing work on preventing and addressing OSEA.

☆ Coordination Meeting Highlights

The coordination sessions focused on aligning the project's upcoming phases, evaluating progress, and reinforcing joint strategies. Key sessions included:

 General Recap & Future Planning of the Awareness Campaign (Da&Da, Storytellme): An overview of completed and upcoming activities, including the next steps for the communication campaign.

- Young Ambassador Contest (Da&Da): A dedicated session to assess the contest's impact and visibility among young people.
- Platform & App Presentation (iED): A detailed walkthrough of the digital tools developed, followed by feedback from partners.
- · Monitoring & Evaluation (Agustina Galantini, external evaluator of the project): An insightful session reviewing the tools and strategies for ongoing assessment, with an emphasis on participatory monitoring.
- Peer Learning Activity: A closing peer-to-peer session focusing on gender and intersectional discrimination as risk factors in OSEA, encouraging open dialogue and experience exchange.

























Learning Activity: Deepening Understanding of OSEA

This training component, co-led by **CESIE ETS**, **DA&DA**, and the **T-ESSERE PONTI group**, explored critical topics related to prevention, identification, and support strategies for those affected by OSEA. Key moments included:

- Prevention through Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE): Engaging activities and discussions around the role of CSE in prevention efforts.
- OSEA Risk Factors: Analysis of online platforms, perpetrator strategies, and exploitation patterns, with a specific focus on minors and marginalised groups.
- Intersectionality & Protection Systems: Sessions highlighting how gender, migration status, and minority identity intersect to shape vulnerabilities and the importance of inclusive, sensitive approaches in support services.
- **Best Practices Exchange**: Partners shared practical examples of prevention strategies across different contexts, including France's "exit prostitution program" and grassroots initiatives with migrant women and families.
